

The Hospice Pro Bono Project

When you sign up, your name will be placed on a list that will be provided to your local hospice. Hospice has received carefully drawn descriptions of the legal documents the volunteer attorneys will provide pro bono. These documents include durable and health care powers of attorney, living wills and simple wills.

When a hospice patient needs one of these documents, a volunteer attorney will be contacted by the local hospice unit and asked if he or she is able to help. If the attorney is able to help, the attorney can then speak with the patient, draft the document(s) and arrange for the document(s) to be signed. The patient will not make the initial contact with the attorney, nor will the hospice patients be given the list of volunteer attorneys.
